If you are new to coaching, or have done some coaching but not undertaken any formal accreditation, then there is an opportunity coming up soon ... read on for more details..... if you become an appointed Club coach you may be entitled to a rebate of 50% of the course fees.

Coaching Accreditation Program

Aspiring coaches in Tasmania have the opportunity to register for a HockeyEd Level 1 (known previously as Beginner) Coaching Course. HockeyEd is the national coaching accreditation program of Hockey Australia.

What: A new HockeyEd Level 1 Coaching Accreditation Course has been developed to provide instruction and assessment in both practical and theoretical aspects of coaching hockey resulting in Level 1 accreditation.

A Level 1 coaching qualification provides the ability to understand and deliver the basic skills of hockey and will also equip the coach with practical examples of skills and drills via a new DVD, handouts and online access.

After the course coaches will have ongoing access to Hockey Australia's coaching skills and drills database as well as priority access to coaching seminars and guest speakers within Tasmania.

When: A Level 1 course will be conducted 26 November 2011. This course is conducted over one full day.

Where: The online theory component of the course will be held at Elizabeth College computer lab followed by the on field and practical component at the Tasmanian Hockey Centre.

Who: The course will be conducted by various accredited coaches and skilled facilitators.

How: To prepare for participation in the Level 1 Coaching course, you need to complete the ASC Coaching General Principles online at <https://learning.ausport.gov.au/jPortal/Courses/tabid/62/Default.aspx>

Cost: \$40 HockeyEd Registration fee + \$30 course fee - total cost \$70

Content: Part 1: Theory Competencies (1.5 hours) - Manage self, athletes, others and environment is delivered as a short theory and discussion session followed by an online assessment.

Part 2: On field Practical (4-6 hours) The on-field practical component of the course will cover various skills and basic concepts. Coaches will be practically assessed in each of the skill areas throughout the day.
